REPORT ON THE PENGUIN INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTAS OF 1963

Hosted by the Mission Bay and San Diego Bay Penguin Fleets and sailed at
Mission Bay Yacht Club, Mission Bay, San Diego, California

July 27, 28, 29, 30, 31 and August 1, 1963

Dave Peterson of Mission Bay paced a field of 18 entries with four firsts and a fourth to win the second Penguin International Junior Championship. Brian Thomas of Mission Bay placed second, winning the third race and with George Machado of Brazil had Peterson boxed in the fifth but Dave, with his crew Creig Greaves, triumphed in a tacking duel that dropped Thomas to fourth behind another fleet mate, Joe Richardson, with Machado finishing second. Machado, 14, and crew Luis de Carvalho, 12, with finishes of 6-3-2-3-2 in a chartered boat settled down after a disastrous luffing match that dropped him from second to sixth in the first race. Final standing were: 1st. Dave Peterson, MB; 2nd. Brian Thomas, MB; 3rd. George Machado, Paqueta (Rio de Janeiro, Brazil); 4th. Joe Richardson, MB; 5th Skip Grey, SD.

The senior championship began with the same smooth water, sunny skies and winds of six to fourteen knots that had blessed the junior event but ran into light air in the third and fourth races. Earl Elms of Mission Bay took the lead at the start of the first race and successively fought off the challenges of DeSousa of San Diego, Marshall of Mission Bay, and Dave Peterson, who finished in that order. In the second race Doug DeSousa showed the skill that gave him first with margins of 2½ minutes in that race, 2 minutes in the third and one minute in the fifth. Elms was second alternating with Dick Rose of Port Washington, in Bruce Lockwood's chartered boat, who was third, in three races. The fourth race was a heartbreaker as the very light air frequently shifted the positions as the fleet searched for wind. Dave Peterson finally captured the lead while Elms, Rose and DeSouza finished en masse. Elms beat Rose by a foot with DeSouza a half a length behind and protested by the race committee for contact with the committee boat. This ultimately cost him the championship.

The fifth race was a spectators delight, a 3½ lap modified Gold Cup course with the windward mark 200 yards from the clubhouse. The best breeze of the regatta saw Marshall, Elms, Machado, Peterson, and DeSouza off first with DeSouza picking off one boat at the first mark and in first place by the second. With 15 marks to round DeSouza lead the remainder of the way with Marshall, Connors of San Diego, Elms, Mulhollen of Alamitos Bay and Rose, though exchanging positions each windward leg, finishing in that order. Elms needed a fourth to win and did despite being as far back as sixth several times and having a potential penalty for touching a buoy, hanging over him.
