WEEK OF JULY 19 SET FOR 1970 NATIONALS; CAMBRIDGE (MD.) YACHT CLUB TO BE HOST

Cambridge Yacht Club on Maryland's Eastern Shore will be the scene of the 1970 Penguin North American Championships from Sunday July 19th through Friday, July 24th, according to Regional Vice-President Robert C. Thompson, who made the arrangements with the Chesapeake Bay organization.

BRAZILIAN WINS INTERNA-TIONALS: ARGENTINIAN 2nd

Corumi III (#8430) crewed by C. Biekarck and J. Ehrensper, won the 1970 Penguin Class Internationals held from January 22 to 31 in Olivos, Argentina. The boat was Brazilian.

Second place went to Argentinians H. Serena and J. Ferrario in Adios IV (#7775).

Biekarck's Corumi III had finishes of 9th, 3rd, 6th, 6th and 14th, while Serena brought Adios IV to a 6th, 10th, 14th, 4th and 4th. Biekarck's total was 347.1 points; Serena's was 347. Close behind was Lantia, (#7788) manned by Argentinians M. Costa and A. von Foerster, who placed 4th, 4th, 11th, 3rd and 17th for a point total of 346.1

Other senior finishers among the top ten (there were
76 entries) were: 4th, Brazil's J. Paradeda and D. Grusner in Jacui (#6563) with 335.
7 points; 5th, Brazil's R.
Senfft and F. de. Azevedo in
Baton (#8723) with 333.7 points;
6th, Brazil's A. Caldas and B.P.
Pires in Rajada (#6166) with

325.3 points; 7th The United States Charles Hayward (Penguin Class President, sailing a borrowed boat) and M. Gomez in Sverige (#8846) with 311 points; 8th, Argentina's P. Gianelli and E. Homps in Kakata (#8211) with 306.8 points; 9th, Brazil's L. Loch and M. F. Texeira in Taquari (#6564); and 10th, Argentina's J. Heller and M. Rossiter in Aracua (#8613). Loch had 300.3 points and Heller had 295.6.

In addition to the Brazilians and Argentinias, there was one United States boat (Haywards) and two Uruguayans.

In the 55 entries in the Juniors there were two Uruguay boats, the rest were Argentina and Brazil. The Brazilians took 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th--the Argentinians won 4th, 9th and 10th.

The top ten included: Pia IV (#9160) sailed by J. Bercht and E. L. Cremer who earned the top spot with finishes of 1st, 6th, 2nd and 10th, for 206 pts.

J. Paradera and D. Grussner in Jacui (#6563) (which took 4th in the Seniors) compiled finishes of 16th, 2nd, 3rd and 1st for a total of 203.1 points.

Also over the 200 mark was Curumi IV (#8849) sailed by C. Cantanhede and C. Pires, who finished 6th, 8th, 5th and 4th, for a total of 201 points.

Fourth place went to M. Costa and L. Buglioni in Lantia (#7788) with a 196.7 total. Fifth was Corumi III, which won the Seniors. C. Biekarck and J. Ehrensper again were crew. Sixth was VIP (#7042) handled by C. V. Chaves and C. Taveres and a total point score of 187.7. Biekarck and and Ehrensper had totalled 190.1.

Also at 167 were the tenth and eleventh place awardees: T. Hoffmann and H. Lizarral in Babiequin and A. J. Ferrer and I. Loyola in Tuze II. Babiequin is #7782 and Tuze II is #9135.

THE 1970 INTERNATIONALS

Charlie Hayward kept a diary of his January, 1970 experiences at the Internationals in Buenos Aires, Argentina. His notes were sent to the Executive Committee and we thought you would be interested in excerpts. A summary of placings will be found elsewhere.

January 24th - Saturday

Arrived at 9:50 a.m. after 12 hours non-stop flight, New York to Buenos Aires. Met by Commodore & Mrs. Cappagli and Captain (Argentine Navy) & Mrs. Mondino. Met officials of Club and shown to my room at Yacht Club Olivos. Immediately questioned about centerboards because some had extended and enlarged handles which filled centerboard slot. Explained why they could be used at this regatta. Gave out handbooks and advised Jr. trophy not received. Brazilian officials cabled Brazilia for trophy. Many questions as to why I am the only American. Other Penguin sailors from U.S. said they would be there. Good luncheon at Captain Mondino's Navy Club. Also have room at Navy Club residence. Junior Championship in progress. All sorts of rain and wind. Approximately 20 out of 50 Juniors capsized on Friday. Question raised as to whether you must have 5 races because others cancelled. Handbook says 3/4ths must approve less than 5 races for International Championship, but nothing stated about Junior Championship. Local committee wished to hold shorter Juniors to devote full time to Seniors. This was O.K. with me and they told Juniors they would try to get in 5, but eventually only got in 4.

January 25th - Sunday

Beautiful day. Juniors got 3rd race in after morning race was called off because time limit ran out due to no wind. Practice race also held for Seniors in light air. I finished second due to good boat speed. Everybody worked very hard to see that I had a good boat. Question was raised about diameter of mast. Enguix (Regatta measurer) showed me where Measurement Certificate states that mast must be certain width between tang bolt and partner but handbook states measurement must be 8' from top of mast. Advised that E.V.P. Tennerstedt and Technical Committee were reviewing plans, specifications and handbook to close loopholes. At all junctures received much praise for Monte and the Blacks for interest in everyone's problems and efficiency.

January 26th - Monday

Juniors finished their 4th race and series with Jorge Bercht, the winner. He hails from Puerto Alegre, Brazil. Went out to watch final Junior race and it was beautifully run. One recall, basically because of poor line.

Continually the Committee boat calls in positions to Club office. Shortly after the race the finishes are published. Also the radio covers the races by periodically advising the standings of the leaders to the radio audience. Before start of Seniors I was interviewed on T.V. by Channel 15, a CBS associate. Senior start resulted in a recall. Wind became a bit fluky and postponement eventually resulted in everyone coming in at about 5 p.m. Race was to start at 3:00. At all times seven coast guard vessels and helicopter were in attendance and in radio contact. Additionally there was a large spectator fleet.

January 27th - Tuesday

The first race was sailed in a moderate breeze. The seas were rather high, particularly towards the end of the race. There were 76 boats starting and 75 finished.

When I came in I was advised that Commodore Wilkinson and I had been invited to have cocktails with Ambassador Lodge at the U.S. Embassy. We had to rush because the races started at 3 o'clock, finished at 5:30 and we had to be at the Embassy at 8. After cocktails we returned to the Penguin world to a giant barbecue. It was a real feast. After all the youngsters left, about 1 a.m., then it was time for the Seniors to have a little more good fellowship. Since they had decided that the next day would be the day to make up the cancelled race, I was a bit concerned about staying up all night. I got to bed at three. It was about a half hour drive back to the Hotel. Thus ended a rather long Tuesday.

January 28th - Wednesday

But Wednesday was longer. For the first race it blew about 25 with very high seas. Had about the same conditions in the afternoon. In each race it was twice around a triangle with a long beat (a leg of the triangle) to the finish. With the three beats there was plenty of hiking. We had to carry ten pounds of ballast. We had homemade bailers and one opened up just as we rounded for the final beat. This cost us seven boats but others had worse luck that day. At the end of three races we were 10th and exhausted. The wind came from the ocean and since there is nothing to break the seas they were steep. The natural current was running against the wind and the seas. It made for some unusual conditions.

Incidentally, they had 3 excellent hoists in which you simply slipped your boat into slings after wheeling it up on club owned dollys. It was a very efficient procedure.

After the regatta we went to a reception on the Brazilian destroyer escort Bauru. This was the ship that transported the Brazilians and their boats and was waiting in the harbor to take them back. There was much Navy brass. I could hardly keep my eyes open after the night before and all that hiking but it was a great experience. The reception ended at 10:30 and then we went to dinner.

January 29th - Thursday

The next day was beautiful, temperature in the 80's and sunny. We sailed to the starting line in a very light breeze and then I learned why they start the races at 3. The prevailing wind came in with regular puffs of about 30. I had a terrible time and was 30th at the windward mark after a good start. We got the feel of things and worked back to 17th.

That evening I entertained my hosts, Commodore & Mrs. Cappagli and Captain & Mrs. Mondino at dinner. Cappagli is President of the Argentina Penguin Association and Mondino is Secretary. We later went to the Club Mau Mau (very interesting).

January 30th - Friday

The first race was started at 4:30 in heavy winds. The current had a strong impact which caused some difficulty in tacking to the weather mark. C. Biekacck was the overall winner, narrowly edging out H. Serena by one tenth of a point. We finished 13th and 7th for the regatta. The boat chartered to me was a very good one and my english speaking crew, Marcello Gomez excellent. That night I was a dinner guest at Captain Mondino's house.

January 31st - Saturday

This was a day of sightseeing and visiting other Clubs. A class meeting was convened at 4:30 p.m. We Covered:

- 1) Self-rescuing
- 2) Boat weight
- 3) Skeg removal
- 4) Change in rules covering masts
- 5) Tightening of plans, measurement certificate and handbook rules to avoid loopholes.
- 6) Dues increase and need for advertising

I said I would recommend:

- 1) Member at Large from Argentina as well as Brazil
- 2) Holding the Internationls more frequently in South America

The awarding of prizes and closing cermonies were very impressive with many dignitaries attending. The band played appropriate national anthems, speeches were made. Prizes were given from 1st to 12th place, with many special trophies presented by various organizations, including the Navy. I lowered the American Flag as the band played and it was very moving, a suitable ending for a most interesting week.

Class relations with South America are very good and there is no question they should have a stronger voice in Class affairs. The South Americans are marvelous sailors, sportsmen and hosts. I hope more North Americans will be able to participate when the Internationals are again held in South America.
