A large delegation of South American Sailors participated and dominated the Junior Series which were run early in the week. Twenty-seven boats participated with Alex Welter of Sao Paulo, Brasil finishing first followed by Martin Costa of Buenos Aires and Jorge Bercht, the defending Internationa Junior Champ, finishing third. Costa led after the first three races but a starting line fraction in the fourth race severly hurt his chances.
