MOORHOUSE CLEANS UP NORTH AMERICANS

Raritan Bay, N.Y. - Skip Moorhouse and crew, Blair Barton, won the 1973 North American Senior Penguin Championship with an almost perfect score. Moorhouse, who sails out of the Mantaloking (N.J.) Yacht Club, put on a display of super boat speed, capturing 4 firsts and a third place for a 12 point lead over his nearest competitor.

Hosted by the Richmond County Yacht Club during the first week in July, the series attracted 31 top entries representing 14 fleets and three regions. A modified Gold Cup course was set up outside of Great Kills Harbor off the south shore of Staten Island. Winds for the series were predominately light and shifty, and the Race Committee had its share of course and line adjustment work.

In the first two races, Moorhouse 1 led all the way with Cliff and Mary Jo Campbell of Toms River, N.J. following to take 2 seconds. The third race was won by Steve and Kathy Sprole of Wet Pants Sailing Association, L.I. Campbell took another 2nd and Moorhouse got his third.

At the end of the first day, Moorhouse led Campbell by 1 point while Jim Wagner with Jill Moorhouse as crew, Mel Reid and daughter, Laura, Steve Sprole and Bill Pagels followed closely in the next 4 positions.

On the second day of racing, the fourth and fifth races and the series went to Moorhouse. His total points added up to 155.9. Mel Reid and Steve Sprole each took a second place, but Cliff Campbell, former International title holder, had a fifth and sixth place finish which was enough to give him the series second with 143.2 points. Mel Reid (another International champion) amassed 139.3 points for series third and Bill Pagels beat out Steve Sprole 133.2 to 133.0 for series fourth.

While Moorhouse romped, the other contestants battled back and forth in a tight series. Unfortunately, the series lacked representation from the Great Lakes, Gulf and Pacific Coast regions which could have added to the excitement on the race course as well as on shore.

The Richmond County Y.C. gave the contestants good racing and fun ashore with a buffet for the seniors and a dance for the juniors. The IPCDA and the contestants extend their thanks to the RCYC committees and especially to Pete Milnes and Larry Owen and the other Penguin sailors from Great Kills who have been involved in racing and regattas for many years.

JUNIOR NORTH AMERICAN TITLE TO KEMPTON

The Junior North American Penguin Championship, held by the R.C.Y.C. the two days prior to the senior championship in the same area, drew 13 entries.

Seventeen year old Terry Kempton with brother Kevin crewing from Toms River N.J. sailed to finishes of 2,1,1,3,1 for a total of 62.5 points and the title. Paul LaBossiere with crew Joan Van Herwarde from Packanack Lake, N.J. was second with 1,3,2,5,3 for 55.2 points.

The host club held the next two positions with Kathy Hall and Mary Milnes winning the 4th race and taking third place honors and Gordon and Doug Milnes capturing fourth place.

Charlie Kraft and crew Julie Moore from Potomac River Fleet rounded out the top five. These five juniors qualified to sail in the Senior event where Terry and Kevin Kempton finished ninth.

PROFILES: THE NEW N.A. CHAMPION

Skip Moorhouse grew up surrounded by Penguin sailors. He and younger sister, Jill, were part of the Sea Cliff Penguin scene and the many regattas and get-togethers engineered and sailed in by their parents - Helen & Marshall (Pud) Moorhouse - and attended by many Penguin notables through the years.

Skip's first big sailing successes came in the Blue Jay class in the JYRA of Long Island Sound. His junior sailing instructor - Bill Blackman - another Penguin sailor.

As is the case with many Penguin skippers, Skip also sails many other boats successfully. This is his first IPCDA title.
