



PRESIDENT'S/LEUKEMIA CUP 2010

September 11 & 12, 2010 Potomac River Sailing Association & The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society Washington Sailing Marina, Alexandria, VA Notice of Races

- 1 RULES
- 1.1 The Potomac River Sailing Association will organize the President's/Leukemia Cup Regatta on the Potomac River from the Washington Sailing Marina in Alexandria, VA.
- 1.2 These races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY
- 2.1 All class-legal boats in one-design classes 20' or under are invited to participate. Classes of 5 or more boats will be started separately. Classes of fewer than 5 boats may be combined with another class.
- 2.2 All competitors must complete an entry form and pay an entry fee to the Potomac River Sailing Association.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available at the PRSA registration table on Friday September 10 and Saturday September 11 (see 2.3 for times).

6 VENUE

- 6.1 The Washington Sailing Marina is located just off of the George Washington Parkway about 1.5 miles south of Reagan National Airport and a similar distance north of Old Town Alexandria. The street address for Internet directions is 1 Marina Drive, Alexandria, Virginia 22314.
- 6.2 Upper course: Classes scheduled to sail for 2 days will sail off of Haines Point (with the Capitol and monuments as a backdrop).

Lower course: Classes scheduled to sail for 1 day (Penguins, El Toros, Flying Scots, and Lasers) will sail off of the powerplant and only a short distance from the docks.

7 SCORING

7.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

- 7.2 If fewer than 6 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2. If 6 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 8 PRIZES
- 8.1 Trophies: Awards will be given to each member of the winning crews. The depth of awards will be based on the expected number of participants in each class; 4 deep for classes with 13 or more expected boats, 3 deep for 9-12 boats, 2 deep for 5-8 boats, and 1 for 2-4 boats. The expected number will be estimated based on participation in 2009 or as provided by a fleet representative to the regatta chair.
- 8.2 Sailors will also compete for the perpetual Normal C. Schaller Memorial Trophy. It is awarded to the skipper with the best record in fleets of 10 or more starters in at least half the races.

9.3 Fundraising Options

To raise funds, individuals should register with the LLS via the National Capitol Area 2010 Leukemia Cup Series Website (http://www.leukemiacup.org/nca/). Individuals may then collect contributions via a fundraising website (provided by the LLS) or by collecting and turning in cash/check contributions at registration for the regatta.

Raffle tickets (\$20 each) are available via the LLS or participating fundraisers for sale. Individuals may also choose to sell raffle tickets as part of their fundraising efforts, with proceeds collected credited to the overall fundraising total (no obligation for unsold tickets). The raffle drawing will be held on September 8, 2010, 8pm at Cantina Marina (600 Water St, SW). Raffle prizes are described below; you need not be present to win.

9.4 National Capitol Area Prizes

Multiple prizes for the top 10 individual fundraisers from across this, the PHRF, and poker run events include **Mt. Gay Rum hats**, electronics, special gifts from Gary, and more!

A fun prize pack will be awarded to each member of the top two fund-raising boats, that is, to the skipper and crew of the boat whose crew collectively raise the most and the second most. The Leukemia Cup will be awarded to the top fundraising boat across the PHRF Leukemia Cup Regatta and the (one design) President's/Leukemia Cup Regatta.

Two participation prizes will be awarded: one for the club that raises the most funds and one for the club with the largest number of boats registered at the Leukemia Cup level (\$100+). Fundraising up to the day of the regatta counts towards these participation prizes.

A grand prize (winner's choice), first prize, and second prize will be awarded in the raffle drawing:
